

When I began taking piano lessons at the age of eight, I never imagined music would affect me in the way that it has. Playing music has become my destiny, my responsibility, my aspiration. Music is not more important to me than God or family, though as I study why God created music it has become evident to me how serious music is as a career choice. The fact that the body can use an instrument made by man and instantaneously create sounds which cause others to feel emotion is incomprehensible to me. More amazing to me, particularly in jazz, one can improvise sounds and still create music pleasing to the ear. When I think about the music I play and what happens when it is performed, I realize I am not creating it all on my own strength. It is true I must spend countless hours in practice and preparation, but there is a "Spiritual" aspect to music I do not totally control. I have come to understand that God causes people to feel encouraged, uplifted, happy, reflective, healed, blessed, or whatever they need when they listen to His music. Now I see the music I do needs to have the same effect. This is why music has become so earnest to me as a career.

The songs on this CD represent years of my composing endeavors. Some of them were written a few months or so before the recording, but many date back to my undergrad and grad years. Fond memories remain of sitting in the lonely, isolated practice rooms at Tech and Southwest, losing track of time and location, creating music. I entered the room around 8 p.m. and left the next day somewhere around 3 or 4 a.m. Though a little frightened due to the darkness in the music building and outside, I surged with excitement of the new music God had given me — anticipating the day when I would be on stage with the greatest musicians in the world playing the music I'd just created. Once finishing my formal education, I realized these songs needed little alteration even though I possessed a greater knowledge of how to put music together. This insight lends itself to the fact that God started sending me melodies before I really knew what I was doing. My education had to catch up with what He had already been giving me.

My desire is that you will enjoy this project forever, and hopefully, you are "more than just entertained" by this music!


